1. Overall Activities in our Orphanages:

1.1 Daily Timetable from Monday to Saturday:

Our daily schedule in the orphanages is meticulously crafted to provide structure, routine, and ample opportunities for learning and growth. The day begins at 5:30 am in the morning with the uplifting morning assembly, where children gather for prayers, songs, and motivational talks to start their day on a positive note. Following the assembly, children prepare for school, ensuring they are well-equipped for the day ahead.

Morning sessions see children attending school, with multiple batches organized to accommodate the varying age groups and school timings. After a productive day of learning, children return our home in the late afternoon at 4 pm, where they are greeted with a nourishing snack and time to unwind before evening activities commence.

Evenings are dedicated to study time, divided into group study sessions for collaborative learning, guided study sessions led by caregivers to provide individualized support, and independent study time for children to focus on their assignments and revision. This structured approach to studying ensures that children develop strong academic skills and cultivate a habit of self-discipline.

1.2 Evening Study:

Evening study sessions are an integral part of our children's academic routine, designed to reinforce learning, complete homework assignments, and prepare for upcoming assessments. Under the guidance of dedicated wardens and caregivers, children engage in focused study sessions tailored to their individual needs and learning styles.

Group study sessions foster collaboration and peer learning, allowing children to benefit from collective knowledge and support. Guided study sessions provide personalized assistance to children who may require additional help or clarification on

academic concepts. Additionally, independent study time encourages self-directed learning and instils a sense of responsibility and accountability in children for their academic progress because our orphanages are home to students ranging in age from first standard to university studies.

By providing structured evening study sessions, we aim to cultivate strong study habits, enhance academic performance, and empower children to become lifelong learners.

1.3 Nutritious Food:

Nutrition plays a pivotal role in the overall health and well-being of our children. We prioritize providing balanced and nutritious meals to ensure their physical and cognitive development. Our children are served three wholesome meals a day, comprising a variety of fresh and locally sourced ingredients such as vegetables, eggs, nuts, fish and chicken.

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner are meticulously planned to provide essential nutrients, vitamins, and minerals necessary for growth and energy. Additionally, nutritious snacks are provided between meals to sustain children's energy levels and prevent hunger.

Our menu includes a diverse range of foods, including grains, vegetables, fruits, proteins, and dairy products, to ensure a well-rounded diet. We recognize the importance of dietary diversity in promoting healthy eating habits and supporting overall health and development.

We have enough janitors, cooks, watchmen, and child caregivers on hand to adequately run the orphanages.

By prioritizing nutritious food, we aim to nourish our children's bodies and minds, laying the foundation for a lifetime of good health and well-being.

In addition to our orphanages, we also house students who are completing their academic work at the C.S.I. Hostel.

They also learn to respect diverse perspectives, negotiate differences, and work collaboratively towards common goals.

1.10 Grooming Family Values through Cottage Living:

1.11 Children Health Check-up:

In addition to routine health check-ups, we organize medical camps and health awareness programs to educate children about hygiene, nutrition, and disease prevention. 2. Special Home and School for Differently-Abled Children and Adults:

2.1 Daily Learning Activities for Mentally and Physically Challenged Children and Adults:

2.1.1 Pudhu Udhayam:

Pudhu Udhayam serves as a nurturing home and educational institution for children under the age of 14 with physical and mental challenges. At Pudhu Udhayam, our primary focus is on equipping these children with the essential Activities for Daily Life Skills (ADLS), laying the foundation for their independence and self-sufficiency. Through tailored learning programs and dedicated care, we guide our young residents in mastering fundamental tasks such as brushing, dressing, undressing, combing, bathing, and more. By fostering the acquisition of these skills, we empower our children to navigate daily life with increased confidence and autonomy, nurturing their development and enhancing their quality of life. Pudhu Udhayam stands as a beacon of hope and support, providing a safe and enriching environment where every child can flourish and thrive despite their challenges.

2.1.2 Daily Class:

In the Daily Class sessions, our focus is on providing specialized education and skills training tailored to the unique needs and abilities of differently-abled children and adults. The curriculum encompasses a range of activities designed to enhance their independence, functional abilities, and overall quality of life.

Classroom activities include instruction on essential life skills such as personal hygiene, grooming, dressing, and self-care routines. Through interactive lessons and hands-on demonstrations, participants learn practical strategies for managing everyday tasks and fostering greater autonomy in their daily lives.

In addition to life skills training, our Daily Class sessions also incorporate therapeutic interventions to support the physical, cognitive, and emotional well-being of

participants. Physiotherapy sessions aim to improve mobility, strength, and coordination, utilizing targeted exercises and assistive devices to enhance physical function and reduce limitations.

Furthermore, yoga sessions provide a holistic approach to promoting physical fitness, relaxation, and mental wellness. Participants engage in gentle stretching, breathing exercises, and mindfulness practices tailored to their individual needs, fostering a sense of balance, calm, and inner peace.

Through our Daily Class sessions, we empower differently-abled individuals to develop essential life skills, build confidence, and maximize their potential for personal growth and fulfilment.

2.2 Pudhu Vidiyal:

Pudhu Vidiyal, meaning "New Dawn," symbolizes the promise of a brighter future for differently-abled individuals, filled with opportunities for learning, growth, and self-discovery. This special school is meant for physically and mentally challenged persons above 18 years of age. At Pudhu Vidiyal, we are committed to fostering a supportive and inclusive environment where participants can explore their interests, develop vocational skills, and pursue their passions. Through tailored programs and personalized attention, we empower them to overcome barriers and unlock their full potential. Pudhu Vidiyal stands as a beacon of hope and opportunity, guiding individuals on their journey towards independence and fulfilment.

2.2.1 Handcrafts-Making:

Handcrafts-making is a popular vocational activity offered as part of our Pudhu Vidiyal program, allowing participants to express their creativity and learn valuable artisanal skills. From simple handicrafts to intricate artworks, participants engage in various projects using materials such as fabric, paper, clay, and recycled materials.

Through hands-on guidance and instruction from skilled artisans, participants learn techniques such as sewing, embroidery, weaving, and paper crafting. These activities not

only enhance participants' fine motor skills and coordination but also provide a source of personal satisfaction and accomplishment.

In addition to handcrafts-making, our vocational training programs encompass a diverse range of skills to meet the interests and abilities of participants. Other vocational skills taught include mattress weaving, necklace making, candle making, and phenol production, providing participants with opportunities for skill development, economic empowerment, and social inclusion.

2.2.2 Goat-Rearing:

Goat-rearing is an innovative livelihood initiative introduced as part of vocational training, offering participants the opportunity to gain practical experience in animal husbandry and agricultural entrepreneurship. Under the guidance of experienced mentors, participants learn the fundamentals of goat rearing, including animal care, feeding, breeding, and health management.

Through hands-on training and mentorship, they develop essential skills in animal husbandry, business management, and sustainable agriculture. They learn to raise healthy and productive goats, manage livestock expenses, and market goat products such as milk, meat, and manure.

Goat-rearing not only provides them with a source of income and livelihood but also fosters a sense of responsibility, stewardship, and connection to nature. By engaging in sustainable agricultural practices, participants contribute to food security, economic resilience, and environmental conservation in their communities.

3. Village Outreach Programmes and Activities:

3.1 Village Outreach:

In our commitment to serving the broader community, we organize various village outreach programs and activities aimed at addressing the needs of marginalized populations, promoting social inclusion, and fostering sustainable development. Through targeted interventions and collaborative partnerships, we strive to create positive impact and empower individuals and families in rural areas.

Our village outreach initiatives encompass a range of activities designed to address key social and economic challenges faced by rural communities. 3.3 The Role of the Sponsorship Department:

Our sponsorship department plays a crucial role in facilitating meaningful connections between sponsors and beneficiaries, ensuring the effective implementation of sponsorship programs, and maximizing the impact of donor contributions. In keeping with its goals and principles, St. Joseph's Development Trust chooses the communities' poorest and most marginalized youngsters. Bro. Sebastian, the Executive Director of St. Joseph's Development Trust, is in charge of the Sponsorship division. With his meticulous supervision supporting the sponsorship team as they implement several community-based programs. After visiting several villages, the sponsorship department team will choose the worthy kids for our programs. They are accountable for organizing different gatherings and workshops for our sponsored children's families as well as the kids themselves.

Key responsibilities of the sponsorship department include:

- Beneficiary Matching: Matching sponsors with eligible beneficiaries based on shared interests, preferences, and sponsorship criteria to foster meaningful and mutually beneficial relationships.
- Communication Facilitation: Facilitating regular communication between sponsors and beneficiaries through letters, updates, and photos to foster a sense of connection, support, and encouragement.
- Program Monitoring and Evaluation: Monitoring the progress and well-being of sponsored beneficiaries through regular field visits, assessments, and feedback mechanisms to ensure program effectiveness and accountability.
- Reporting and Transparency: Providing sponsors with regular updates, impact reports, and financial statements to demonstrate the tangible outcomes of their contributions and ensure transparency and accountability.

Our Executive Director would receive a report from our team detailing each student's overall success in the school. These visits often include:

- Student Interaction: We engage with students through interactive sessions, extracurricular activities, and educational games to encourage learning, creativity, and personal development.

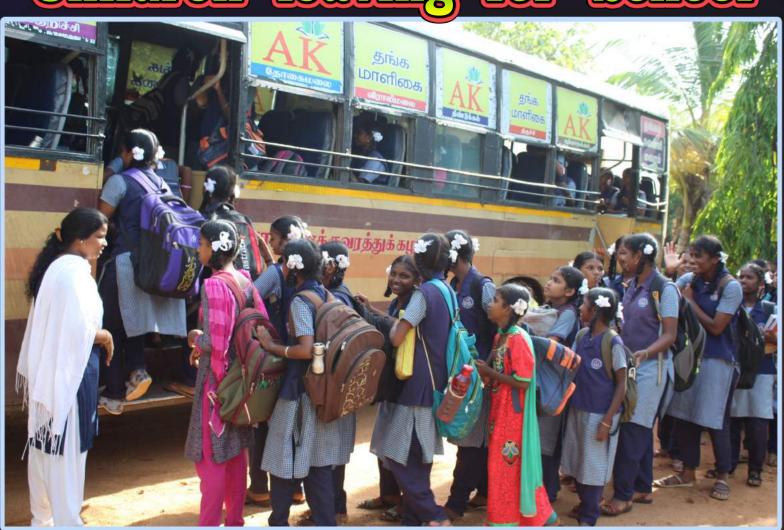
