The situation of the child and Family before coming into our Care:

The family of Karthika is from Nallakaruppanpatti village, near Periyakulam of Theni District. Karthika comes from an underprivileged section of her village society. Both



parents were agricultural coolies depending on their meagre daily earnings for their livelihood. They couldn't get work every day. They had two children. It was financially too difficult to send their children to school. Parents wished to provide some basic formal education to Karthika as they didn't like their daughter to suffer like them. During that time, SJDT was conducting regular evening tuition centre in the village. Karthika began to attend tuition classes every day along with many other children of the village. Although Karthika was

struggling in academics, she was very enthusiastic and active in extracurricular activities. However, at SJDT's personalised special intervention, she was motivated to study well. She was taken into SJDT's sponsorship programme as she was determined to continue study with the help of sponsorship.

Karthika's Development under the Care of SJDT:

Karthika began to enjoy her sponsorship programme in various ways. SJDT organized large gatherings of children once in three months. Oftentimes, programmes were held in one of the villages and other times at the Head Office of SJDT. Topics such as the

importance of education, hard work, discipline, responsibility, and health awareness were well received by the children. Karthika's association with SJDT helped her to become a disciplined and hard-working girl. The staff of SJDT provided personal counselling and psychological motivation to perform better in her studies. During her formative years she became aware of conservation of the environment. The family hardships Nanthini experienced prior to the Care of SJDT:

The Situation of Saranya and her Family before coming into the care of SJDT:

When Saranya was four years old, her father eloped with a lady, leaving behind two children with her ailing mother. The whole responsibility of taking care and providing for the family fell on the sickly mother. But unfortunately, Saranya's mother also did not live

longer. The sickness became more malignant, and she died without any help from the relatives. Noticing the plight of the two little girls, some concerned neighbours informed the local police authorities, who after preliminary enquiries, placed the children under the care of their grandmother. However, the



grandmother couldn't take care of the grandchildren as she was already aged and ailing. The grandmother brought Saranya to SJDT, and requested to be accepted as an orphan. Thus Saranya began her life at Pudhu Vasantham in 2009 when she was nine years old.

Saranya's Development under the Care of SJDT:

Having been abandoned at a young age, life was not easy to digest for Saranya. She had to adjust to the various day-to-day activities of the new place. The program of Pudhu Vasantham was meant to provide important skills for life. Programs like weekly panchayat meetings, daily games, personality development programs, moral classes, orientation to life, interactive skills, etc. motivated and encouraged her to move on from her past life. Bro. Sebastian used to remind her "Even the biggest of one's dreams can remain the smallest of one's ideas without one's hard work and vice versa". Life was not always comfortable and cozy for Saranya. But she knew that the all programs were meant to offer a real-life enriching experience. Coupled with her continuous efforts she could transform for a better future. Saranya was able to sharpen her social, interpersonal, emotional, and cognitive skills. Pudhu Vasantham became the right place to explore all her talents and skills hidden inside of her and develop many more new valuable skills.

Saranya's Status at Present: When one of our staff met Saranya recently, she welcomed him with a big smile. She was very happy to remember all her past life which had moments of great pain, sufferings, but finally joy and happiness. With an overwhelming voice, Saranya shared her experiences. "The people in Pudhu Vasantham were very loving and caring. I could somehow feel that love and care were intertwined in all the activities we were involved. During my crying moments, Bro. Saranya's grandmother was responsible for arranging the marriage. For Saranya, her grandmother and SJDT are the guiding stars of her life. **Conclusion:** Despite having lived through severe poverty and hardship as a child, Saranya's residential learning at Pudhu Vasantham helped her to enhance all present opportunities for better future. S. Gowsalya **Introduction:** Living in poverty is not the end of hope or life. The key things needed to break down the walls that imprison those within poverty are support networks such as friends or family, awareness of opportunities, and access to resources. With this combination, a new life is possible. Yes, it was SJDT that helped S. Gowsalya to come out of her poverty through education. Here the story of new life... The situation of Gowsalya and her Family before coming into the care of SJDT: Gowsalya was born at Kamanpatti, near Sembati of Dindigul district. Being born and brought up in a very poor family, life was never easy for Gowsalya. Her father was a Lorry Cleaner. Gowsalya's mother was a housewife and she had to nurture four children. The salary of the father was just enough for the food. When Gowsalya was ready for primary schooling, her parents initially thought of admitting her in the Government school. The Parents found it very difficult to send their three children to school due to the paucity of funds to manage the family expenses as well as the education of the children. Though her siblings continued their schooling, Gowsalya's hope of beginning her primary education seemed to be less likely. In the end, her parents decided not to send Gowsalya to school. They were of the opinion that her going to school was of no use to her as well as for the family. It was at this juncture, SJDT offered the home based sponsorship for Gowsalya.

Gowsalya's Development under the Care of SJDT: SJDT's intervention was amazing in Gowsalya's childhood, and she would talk about it at length with her parents and friends. The leadership program and other group activities organized by SJDT helped Gowsalya in so many ways. Gowsalya never involved in extracurricular activities such as public speaking and cultural programmes. She was noticed being scared and solitary. When it was brought to the notice of Bro. Sebastian in one of the meetings, he made sure she got involved and earned her acclaim. As a result, she found herself participating in activities she had never considered doing, or avoided. With the meagre resources at their disposal, the family could not afford even basic education for the children. The parents feared that their kids would grow up with



lower earning potentials due to lack of proper education and would never liberate themselves from the cycle of poverty. It was under such miserable situation, Chella Kannu, the youngest among six female children, was identified for the sponsorship program of SJDT.

Chella Kannu's Development under the Care of SJDT:

Chella Kannu was fortunately blessed to mingle with different types of children brought together for various activities of SJDT, such as Personality Development, Time Management, Leadership, Self & Public discipline, and service to infuse nobler qualities in children's early childhood. In the beginning, She used to be aloof and had difficulties mingling or interacting with other children. However she was motivated to participate actively in every program. She began to enjoy her participation in every activity with renewed interest and enthusiasm. As days progressed, she realized that those activities were not bad, but were meant to foster self-discipline and stability in one's life. She began to participate in the group study and group games organised in her village by the village animators of SJDT. Chella Kannu's interest in those activities were so impressive that she would invite other children of her village to participate also. Thus, the friendly and enabling approaches of SJDT with the children helped Chella Kannu to attain higher educational achievements.

The Situation of Sona Sree and her Family before coming into the care of SJDT: Sona Sree was born in an impoverished family in a small village called, Azhagarnayakkanpatti, near Sembatti in Dindigul District. This poor family had two children. The father was the sole breadwinner of the family. He worked as a Lorry cleaner and it was not an easy one. Though he was a good man in general, he would spend most of his earnings on drinking. This forced Sona Sree's mother to look for work on her own and make up for the livelihood of the family. Often family would struggle for food and other necessities. Sona Sree's mother had to lead a harsh and challenging life in order to maintain the family and rearing the two children. Under such difficult situation, school education for the two children was a mirage, rather than reality. But she didn't want her children to suffer without proper education. As she was desperately looking for some assistance for her children's education, one of her neighbours informed her about the sponsorship programme in SJDT which was already organising different programmes in her village. Sona Sree's Development under the Care of SJDT: The Tuition centre based programmes organised by SJDT had been attracting many children who otherwise had no way of improving their academic standards in their respective schools. Sona Sree gladly got enrolled in the Tuition centre programme and started involving in other extracurricular activities. By attending fun games, group games

and other leisure activities she was motivated to work and interact with all other children.

As a result, she was able to speak, discuss and work with different types of people during

large gatherings both at SJDT as well as in her village. She learnt to be respectful, mild mannered, and congenial by spending more time with children studying together, playing together, and working together. She was able to pick up new skills by her active participation in different programs organized by SJDT. This has helped her to develop effective interactive skills for her present life.

Sona Sree's Status at Present:

When one of the SJDT staff met Sona Sree at her home recently, she looked confident and convincing about her present situation. Recalling the past bitter experience with her father, she said,



"Having a father with incurable alcoholism was an endless disappointment during my childhood. I knew it was not really "my father", it was the alcohol, and I was hopeful the horrors will end soon. That hope kept me going, even when I was very confused, distracted and sad. My hope did not go in vain as came in contact with

SJDT and all its outreach initiatives in my village."

While talking about the turning point in her life, she explained, "St. Joseph's Development Trust was conducting evening tuitions in our village. I joined and studied in that tuition centre. In 2003, while I was studying 3rd standard I was enrolled in the sponsorship program. The scholarships, uniforms, notebooks, and the writing materials provided by St. Joseph's Development Trust kept me going in my studies. Otherwise it would not have been possible to do my studies. I was sponsored until the completion of my Diploma in nursing studies as well as and Diploma in Computer Application (DCA)".

Sona Sree got married to Mr. Soundrapandi in 2020 and living in Azhagarnayakkanpatti. The husband is a Bus Driver. She leads a happy married life at

present. Now She is successful interacting, conversing, and understanding her husband, inlaws' family members, and her children.

The Situation of Thamaraiselvi and her Family before coming into SJDT's Care:

Thamariselvi is from Sriram Nagar, near Periyakulam of the Theni District. Her

parents had three children. Thamaraiselvi's mother was a housewife. Thamaraiselvi's father was an agricultural coolie. He wouldn't get a regular job every day. The poor financial situation of the family made it hard to meet the basic needs of the members. Since her father was the sole breadwinner, the mother tried to bring in additional money by doing jobs such as house cleaning, etc., which were only temporary. If children were lucky, they occasionally would have two meals



a day. Thamaraiselvi's mother relied on others for the schooling of the children. Life was very difficult for Thamaraiselvi. Her future seemed very bleak as the parents thought of stopping her from school, although they wished her to attend the school continuously. At this crucial junction, Thamaraiselvi was put in contact with SJDT through a family friend.

Thamaraiselvi's Development under the Care of SJDT:

Thamaraiselvi was a bright child by nature and all she needed was the right and gentle nudging for better performance. She was given plenty of chances to improve her talents on different occasions and platforms. One of the issues that Thamaraiselvi had to deal with was her tendency to be introverted. This hindered from unfolding her potentialities to the full. Bro. Sebastian noticed her problem and motivated her to come out of her introversion. SJDT staff on their part grouped her with other children to discuss a given issue and come up with appropriate solutions. Her skills were appreciated in front of others. Repetitive appreciation in front of others was a boost to Thamaraiselvi's self-confidence and in turn, helped to diminish her feelings of self-doubt and insecurity. Over a period of time, she was able to cope effectively with the outside world. Although Thamaraiselvi was lacking in self-confidence and verbal expressions, her constant interaction with others helped her to be effective in conversing and speaking in front of others. When our SJDT staff visited her recently, Thamaraiselvi welcomed them with gratitude. She expressed the following with a sense of pride: "In 2015, while I was studying the seventh standard I got enrolled in the sponsorship program provided by St. Joseph's

Development Trust. Together with me, many other children were also enrolled in the



till the completion of my 11th standard."

sponsorship program. I had a beautiful experience of living together at Pudu Punal. I was brought up with love and care. The staff at Pudhu Punal accepted me with my uniqueness and motivated me to grow as I was. The scholarships, uniforms, school bags, notebooks, and writing materials provided by SJDT helped in my education. I was sponsored

Thamaraiselvi got married to Mr. Sarathkumar in 2021. He is a Lorry driver. He earns a sufficient amount of money as his salary. The couple is settled in the City of Madurai. Thamaraiselvi lives with the family of her extended in-laws, and they all are taking care of her very well.

As a young girl, Thamaraiselvi had the grit and determination to overcome all the negative hurdles that tried to supress her. She needed the opportunity and SJDT provided just that.
