

I am V. Daisy Rani, 24 year girl from Mannankorai village in the then Trichy District (At present Ariyaloor District). Mr. Vanathaiyan is my father and he expired when I was a child. My mother is Mrs. V. Rabhal Mary. I am only a child in the family. My mother alone is the sole breadwinner of the family. We are living in a thatched house.

When I was around 2 years old my father died due to prolonged illness. My mother was shocked at the sudden death of my father and it took several months for my mother to come out of the shock. Until the death of my father my mother did not go for any work. My mother was still young and she was desperately searching for some job to make our living. She started to go for some available agricultural coolie work for meager income. From the earnings she was saving portion of the money for my education but she had to spend the saved money during the non-agricultural season. We were living from hand to mouth.

My mother sent me to school in spite of the financial crisis in the family. I continued my studies up to 5<sup>th</sup> standard in our own village. But when I was studying in 5<sup>th</sup> standard my mother also fell sick and she could not go for regular work. It was at that time brother took me to Pudhu Vasantham home which is in Murugathooran Patti in Dindigul district. I was admitted in that home and was provided with all the basic needs. From there I started to continue my studies. I did my high school studies at R.C. High School at Silukkuvarpatti. I did my higher secondary studies at Holy Cross Higher Secondary School, Kamalapuram, Dindigul District. The staff who were there in Pudhu Vasantham motivated me to perform well in my academic and non-academic activities. I also was good at studies and sports. I was a district level "Kabadi" player and played for the district at few occasions. I scored

good marks in my 12<sup>th</sup> public examination after that as I had lived with the differently abled children who are in Pudhu Udhayam which is in the campus of Pudhu Vasantham, I underwent three months of training in physiotherapy and psychotherapy in Holy Cross College, Trichy. Along with that training I also learned to make toys, garlands and pot painting. Once I completed three months of training at Holy Cross College, I did D.T.Ed (Diploma in Teacher Education) in Immaculate Teacher Training Institute which is at Karaikal. I also completed B.A. English Literature through correspondence course in Alagappa University which is at Karaikdi.

Once I completed all my studies, brother provided me opportunity to work in the same organization where I lived and studied. I joined the organization as an evaluator of the Complementary School Programme. I performed well in the given responsibility and so after a year I was promoted as evaluator of the Women Self Help Group programmes. I also underwent different trainings and promoted as ToT (Trainer of Trainees) for Women SHG Programmes. I have organized different programmes for the women self help group members of our organization. As of now I am promoted as Field Executive for the MFI (Micro Finance Institution) department of our organization.

Meanwhile I got married in the year 2010 and have twin daughters. In the year 2011, my husband died due to electric shock at the working place. That was the saddest moment of my life and all my dreams were shattered. I also wanted to die along with my husband but brother, my mother and relatives saved me. It took some months for me to come back to normal stage. I decided to live for my twin daughters. At present I am working in the same organization and with the earnings I am meeting out my expenses. I am very sure that I will provide good education to my twin daughters and settle them well in their life. I am confident only because I have studied and sure to continue to work till my daughters get settled. would like to thank the organization and the sponsors who supported me for my studies and growth for so many years and helped me to reach this stage. I also would like to acknowledge that if it were not the intervention of brother and the continuous support of the sponsors I would have been a school dropout and lived a very pathetic life in a remotest village and so I once again express my sincere gratitude to the organization and the sponsors for saving my life and helping me to lead a good life.


# M.Shanmugavalli

I am M.Shanmugavalli from Manamadurai village in Dindigul district. My father's name is Mr. Murugan who is no more and my mother is Mrs. Jothi Mani. I have got two younger sisters. We were living in a small thatched house with the meagre income earned by my father through his coolie works.

When I was studying in 5<sup>th</sup> standard my father died due to prolonged illness. When my father was alive he did not allow my mother to go for any work. But after the death of my father my mother started to go for some coolie works. Since the income of my mother was not sufficient to meet all three of ours educational and other family requirements my mother stopped me from going to school since I was the eldest girl and sent me for work. And so after six months of my father's death I was sent to a doctor's house to help them in their household activities like washing dishes, clothes, cleaning house and gardening. I was working there for about two months, at that time I was noticed by one of the relatives of Mr. Paulraj and he informed about my situation to Mr. Paulraj who in turn communicated my situation to Bro.I.Sebastian. In the year 1999, I along with my younger sister by name Kanagavalli was brought to Boys Village where many orphan, semiorphan, poor and under privileged girl children were taken care and provided with all the basics and education. I and my sister were enrolled in Holy Cross Higher Secondary School which is at Batlagundu. I joined in sixth standard. In the year 2000, a new home was opened in Murugathooranpatti for the orphan, semi-orphan, poor and under privileged children and we were shifted to that home. From there I was sent to R.C. Middle School which is at Silukkuvarpatti and there I did my 7th and 8th standard. I studied 9th and 10th standard in RC Higher Secondary School at Silukkuvarpatti. In this home we were provided with all the basic needs and many other additional classes were handled during evening hours, weekends and holidays so as to develop our extracurricular talents. During my stay in Pudhu Vasantham besides studies lalso developed many

other extracurricular talents like dancing and singing. I also developed many leadership qualities through different leadership skill programmes which were organized in this home. Through different literary association programmes and competitions we were encouraged to develop our sportive spirit. I also participated in many sports competitions and took part in school level and district level competitions and won prizes and certificates. In the year 2003 I completed my 10<sup>th</sup> standard. After that I was sent to Chinnalapatti to do my higher secondary studies by staying in home so as to understand and get accustomed with family environment. I took up Home Science group so as to learn about child care. While staying there I could understand how much of money is needed to meet out my educational and other basic needs per year. I realized the value of money from there. While studying 11th and 12th grade I participated in district level swimming competition and won prizes and accolades for my school. I secured 789 marks in my 12th public examinations. After completing my school studies brother sent me to Jayaraj Annapackiam College which is at Periyakulam and there I did ECE course for one year. After completing the course I was appointed as tuition programme coordinator in our St. Joseph's Development Trust, and after few months I was promoted as evaluator of tuition programme and for the past four years I have been working as evaluator of tuition programme. I did B.Sc Psychology through correspondence course and completed it in the year 2010. Today I am earning and helping my mother and sisters and I am very happy. I sincerely thank brother who with fatherly love helped me to reach this stage and until the end of my life I will remember him and at the same time I also thank the sponsors for your continuous support through brother I. Sebastian FSC.

I am A.Nancy from Madurai. I am 16 years old girl and I am doing 11<sup>th</sup> standard in Auxilium Hr.Sec. School which is at Puthoor in Madurai. Mr. Alphonse Immanual is my father and Mrs. Sebasty is my mother. I have one each younger brother and sister. We are living in a rented house.

We were living a very peaceful life until my father became addicted to alcohol. He used to come home drinking and quarelled with my mother. Most of the time my father used to beat my mother very cruelly. He also used to utter very harsh and bad words which should not be heard by small children. But we had no other option than witnessing this on daily basis. As I was the eldest girl I was fed up of this kind of situation and wanted to escape from the family but at the same time I was feeling pity for my mother as she needed someone to console her. My father used to pledge our vessels and other family goods to get money for drinking. He was least bothered about our food and education. My mother used to go for some coolie works and with that income we were fed and educated. There were many incidents when we were outside the house our father used to lock inside in the night and we slept at the entrance of our door. With this type of situation we were living. It was at that time my mother came to know about Pudhu Vasantham through one of our relatives and she decided to enroll me and my younger sister in Pudhu Vasantham home so as to give us good education and safety with other basic needs of life. At that time I was doing 3<sup>rd</sup> standard in Holy Family Primary School which is at Madurai. Once I completed my 3<sup>rd</sup> standard I was admitted in Pudhu Vasantham along with my younger sister in the year 2004. I studied from 4th standard to 10th standard while staying at Pudhu Vasantham. I was sent to R.C. Higher Secondary school which is at Silukkuvarpatti. In Pudhu Vasantham I was provided with all the basic needs.

I got good oppurtunity to develop my extra-curricular talents as well as leadership qualities. Brother, teacher, Devi Bala Aunty, warden all encouraged me to do well in my studies and extra-curricular activities. I learned to tackle the issues. I was good at writing poem and good at singing.

I could continue my studies only with the support of brother who gave me abode in Pudhu Vasantham and helped me in all the ways possible to develop my skills and talents. I consider brother as my father. I will proudly tell everywhere that brother I.Sebastian is like my my father who brought me up with good education.

At present I am doing 11<sup>th</sup> standard in Auxilium Higher Secondary School which is at Puthoor in Madurai. I am staying in a hostel, the food that is provided in the hostel is not so good when I compare it with that of Pudhu Vasantham. Though I am paying Rs.300/- as my mess fee it is nothing compared to the free food that I received in Pudhu Vasantham. I scored 389 marks out of 500 in my 10<sup>th</sup> standard public examination and I am sure to score high marks in the 12<sup>th</sup> Public examination also with the skills I developed at Pudhu Vasantham. I am also School Pupil Leader (SPL) in the school where I am studying at present and it is because of the leadership qualities that I developed at Pudhu Vasantham.

As of now my younger brother and sister are studying and my mother is very happy over our progress. I along with my family members express my sincere gratitude to brother and the sponsors who are supporting me these many years and helping me to have good education and good life. I will always remember you in my prayers and pray for your good health of mind and body. In future once I complete my studies I want to get good job and help many other under privileged children in whatever ways possible like Bro.I.Sebastian.

They are totally four children in the family and all four of them are girls. Their father is a coolie worker and mother is a housewife. Their father left the family and went away when they were very young. Their mother is the main breadwinner of the family and she could not manage all the family requirements as well as educational expenses of all four children.

Before coming to Pudhu Vasantham, Abinaya and Ramya were studying in St. Joseph's Middle School which is at Kodaikanal. Abinaya and Ramya were studying in 5<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> standard respectively when their mother thought of stopping them from going to school due to financial crisis in the family. Their mother could not meet our the educational expenses of all the children with her meagre income and she wanted to send Abinaya for some coolie work to earn additional income for the family so that she could send other small children to school to learn at least the basics of education.

It was at that time their mother came to know about Pudhu Vasantham through one of the staff who was working in Pudhu Vasantham. Through that staff Abinaya and Ramya were admitted in Pudhu Vasantham. In the year 2006 both of them came to Pudhu Vasantham. From there they continued their studies. In the year 2010 both Abinaya and Ramya left Pudhu Vasantham and at that time they had completed 10<sup>th</sup> standard and 7<sup>th</sup> standard respectively.

Both of them were very good at studies and scored high marks in the examination. Abinaya scored 350 marks in her 10<sup>th</sup> public examination. Both of them were active

participants in extra-curricular activities. They say that during their stay at Pudhu Vasantham they developed their personal leadership skills as well as sportive skills through the encouragement and opportunities provided in the home. Abinaya also said that she learned to face the problems with courage and confidence through the staff who worked there as they taught her about facing the real life situations which are embarrassing in nature. Both Abinaya and Ramya said that Brother I. Sebastian is like their father and he helped them in many ways to come out of the grudge feelings that they had on their father who was irresponsible and unapproachable. They said that they are very grateful to brother who admitted them in Pudhu Vasantham and offered them all the basic needs with good education through sponsorship support. She also said that if we did not get brother's support we would have been a school dropout girls doing some menial job to make our living along with our mother and for the intervention offered to us we will be grateful to brother and the sponsors till the end of our life.

At present both Abinaya and Ramya are studying in Mahalakshimi Girls' Higher Secondary School at Batlagundu. Abinaya is studying in 12<sup>th</sup> standard while Ramya is studying in 9<sup>th</sup> standard. They are very happy that through the sponsorship support they are able to continue their studies and thank the sponsors for the support that is being extended to them through Brother I.Sebastian.

I studied from 2<sup>nd</sup> standard to 10<sup>th</sup> standard while staying at Pudhu Vasantham. I was sent to RC Amali Primary School for doing my primary studies. I went to St.Joseph's Middle School for doing my middle school studies and I completed my high school studies at RC Higher Secondary School at Silukkuvarpatti. I scored 356 marks in my 10<sup>th</sup> Public Examination.

During my stay at Pudhu Vasantham, besides studies I was motivated and encouraged to learn many other extracurricular activities and today I am a good dancer and I am very good in elocution also. Brother, staff and other in charges in the home were very supportive and they

helped me to come out of my homesickness and helped me to develop my personal skills.



I developed my athletic spirit and won in different sports competitions. I also developed leadership skills and discipline.
